



ABOUT HOMES FIRST

Our Mission

Homes First develops and provides affordable stable housing and support services to break the cycle of homelessness for those with the fewest housing options.




Homes First Society provides supportive housing, emergency shelter and support services to over 2,300 of the city's most vulnerable people every day, including seniors, families, single mothers, and those with complex physical, psychiatric and substance use challenges.

WhyWeDolt

Simply put, everyone needs a home. Every night there are over 11,000 people without a safe, stable place to live - hundreds are 'living rough' in ravines, stairwells, or on the street.

The lingering effects of the pandemic have also exacerbated the ongoing and intersecting housing, mental health and opiate crises, making stabilization that much harder to achieve. Homes First works to break the cycle of homelessness for the people with the fewest housing options.

2009 We introduced **medical supports** within supportive housing.

In partnership with CAMH, we developed a **reliable pathway for people with profound mental illness** and histories of prolonged hospital stays to access permanent housing.

Our Community Development Program was established, prioritizing our relationships with surrounding communities and advocating for our residents' interests.

2014 We developed onsite **Life Skills** programs to support residents with hoarding, pest control and housekeeping.

2016 We opened our first dedicated shelter for self-identifying women.

We further developed our **Harm Reduction** strategies into multi-year peer programs to support residents in shelter and supportive housing.

We opened a **4 bed hospice** at one of our sites, in partnership with ICHA and St. Elizabeth Health Care.

We opened **3 more shelters**, including our first refugee-dedicated shelter.

In response to the growing need during the pandemic, we opened **3 hotel shelters**, **2 emergency shelters**, were awarded the operating agreement for another shelter.

We were awarded the operations of 2 24-hour intensively supportive housing sites.

We also began discovery for the redevelopment of Strachan House.

We added 150 supportive housing units to Toronto's Inventory.

Homes First currently operates 26 sites - 9 shelters & 17 supportive housing locations, including 24-hour and non-24-hour intensive supports.

We will continue to build a **Homefull Toronto**, a city where everyone has a place to live, thrive, and be hopeful for the future.

We must continue to develop programs and initiatives in response to our neighbours' growing needs.



tonight's HOST



Growing up on the West Island of Montreal, Anthony Farnell developed a love for weather early on. After graduating with a BSc in Meteorology from Vermont's Lyndon State College in 2003, Farnell began his on-air career at KPAX in Missoula, Montana, as a morning meteorologist. He returned to Montreal in 2005 where he worked briefly at Bellator Energy, trading weather derivatives. That same year, Anthony joined Global Montreal's evening newscast but quickly moved to Global Toronto in 2006 to become Chief Meteorologist. Since then, Anthony has expanded his reach and now brings his weather forecasting skills and personality to all four Global News markets in Eastern Canada, from Halifax to the GTA. He can also be heard giving his seasonal forecasts across the Corus Radio Network.

Anthony Farnell has been a long time supporter of the Michael Garron Hospital, formerly TEGH. He helps out several local charities, including Muscular Dystrophy Canada, H2O4All, HOPE and the Safehaven Project for Community Living. Anthony has also been an ambassador for Engage and Change for more than a decade. Their Project Water and Project Winter Survival campaigns help bring needed supplies to vulnerable homeless on the streets of Toronto. He also makes time to visit schools and local libraries where he and his sidekick, Storm the Weather Dog, teach kids all about meteorology. Besides being a great friend of Farnell's, Storm is famous in his own right; he's been featured on numerous national newscasts like CNN and Good Morning America and even made the late-night rounds on Jimmy Kimmel and Conan.

We know the way forward.


All that's left is the collective compassionate commitment of a unified community to make this our reality.

We're committed to a Homefull Toronto. But we can't get there without you.






